

Conference Attendance Terms and Conditions

1. Registration & Payment

All attendees must register via the official conference website or designated platform.

Where payment is required, registration is confirmed only upon full payment of applicable fees.

Fees are non-refundable unless stated otherwise in the cancellation policy.

2. Submission & Presentation

Abstracts and papers must be submitted by the published deadlines and conform to the conference's formatting guidelines.

Presenters must register to confirm their place in the program.

The organizing committee reserves the right to reject submissions that do not meet academic standards or relevance.

3. Cancellation & Refund Policy

Cancellations must be submitted in writing to the conference organiser.

Refunds (if applicable) will be processed according to the timeline and conditions specified on the registration page. No refunds will be issued for no-shows.

4. Code of Conduct

Attendees must behave respectfully toward other participants, speakers, and staff.

Harassment, discrimination, or disruptive behaviour will not be tolerated.

The organiser reserves the right to remove any attendee violating the code of conduct without refund.

5. Privacy & Data Use

By registering, attendees consent to the collection and use of their personal data for conference-related communications.

Photos, videos, and recordings may be taken during the event and used for promotional purposes.

Attendees may opt out of media inclusion by notifying the organiser in advance.

6. Virtual Attendance Guidelines

The conference may offer virtual participation options via designated platforms (e.g., Zoom, Microsoft Teams, or a proprietary portal).

Virtual attendees must register in advance and will receive access credentials prior to the event.

Sharing login details or streaming conference content to unregistered individuals is strictly prohibited.

Some sessions may be recorded and made available post-event; access will be limited to registered participants.
